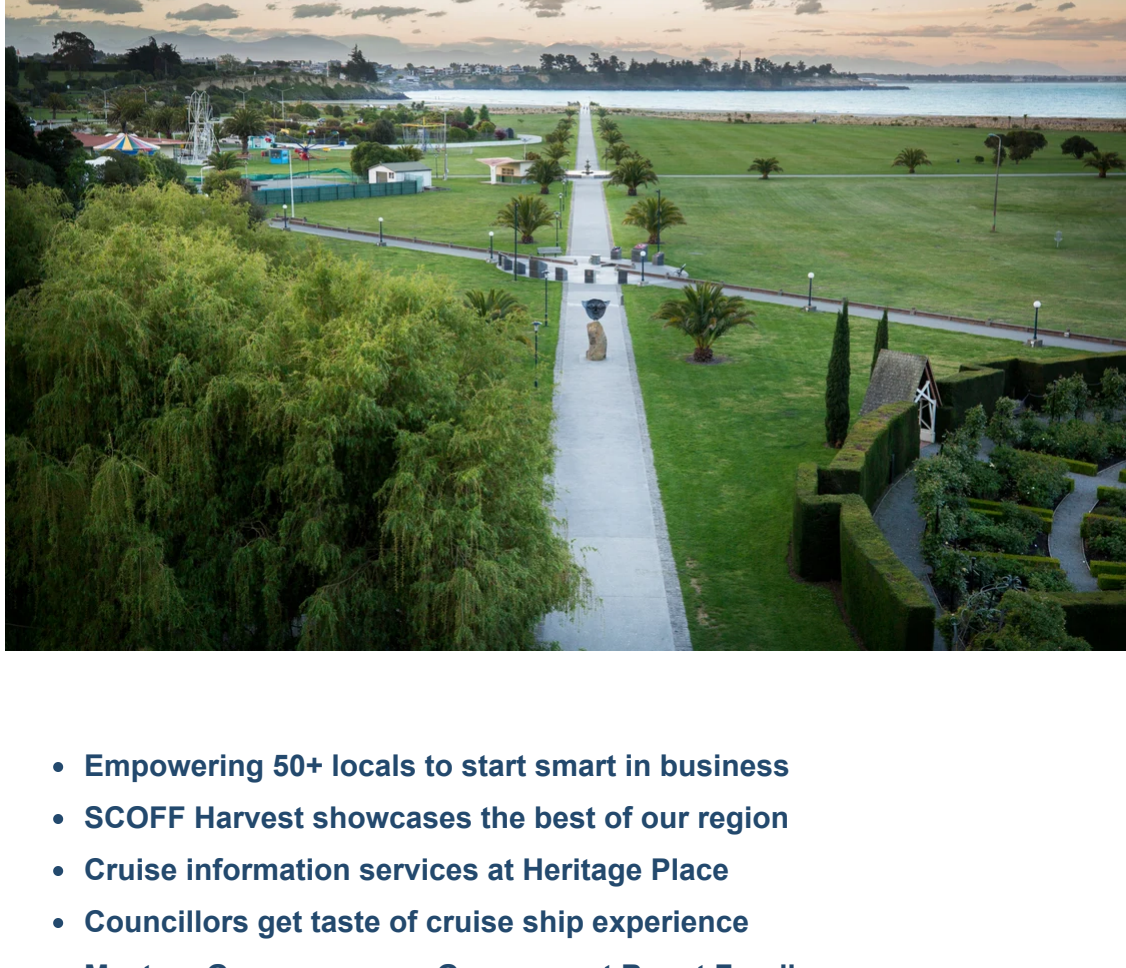
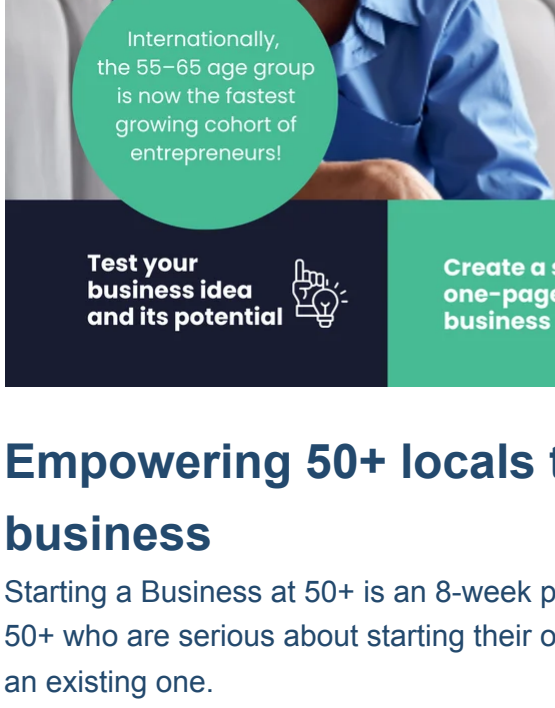

Starting a Business at 50+ is an 8-week programme we are offering for people aged 50+ who are serious about starting their own business or redefining the direction of an existing one.

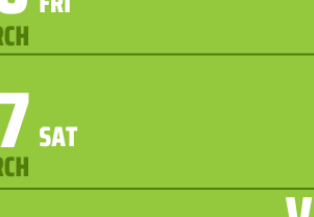

SCOFF Harvest showcases the best of our region

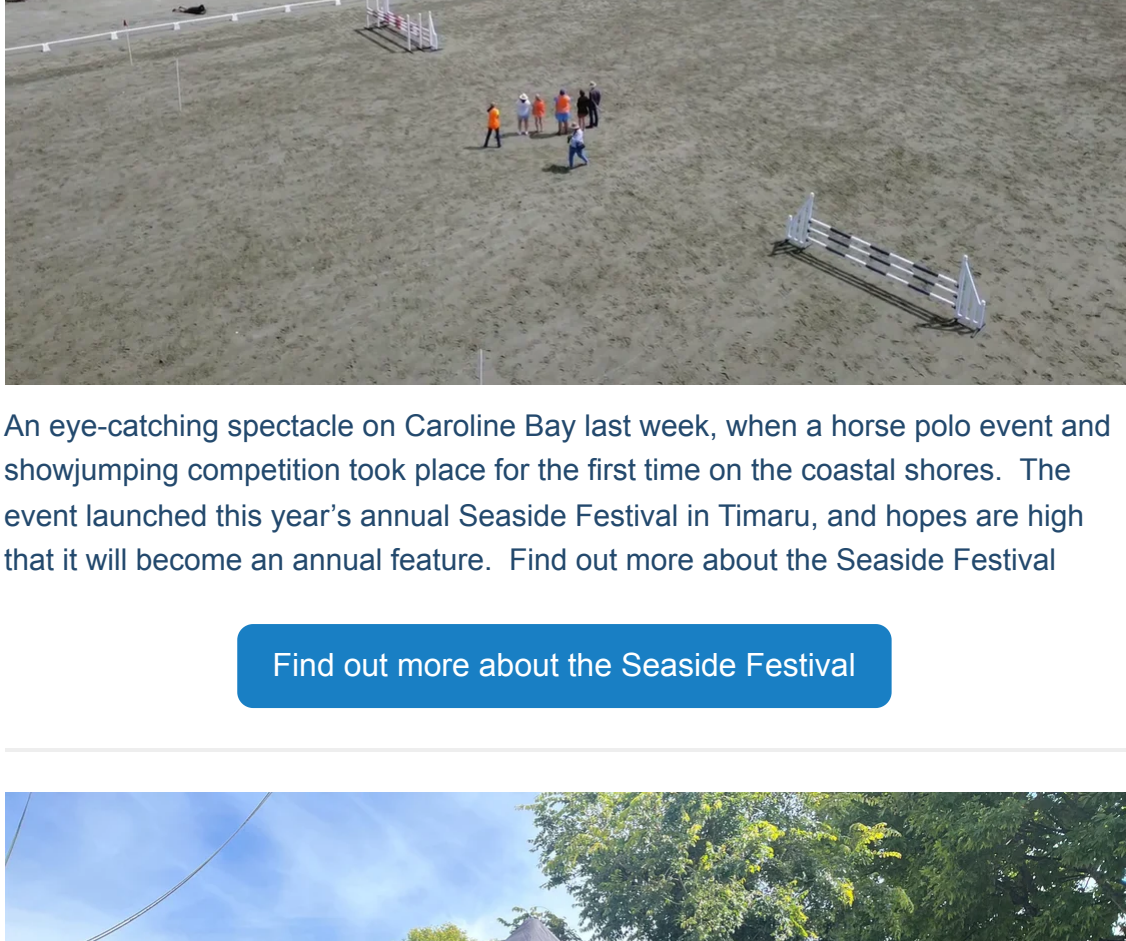
Celebrate the season of abundance with SCOFF Harvest, a brand-new mini food festival running from 5–15 March 2026.

We are collaborating with a handful of South Canterbury eateries to bring you a collection of exciting events.

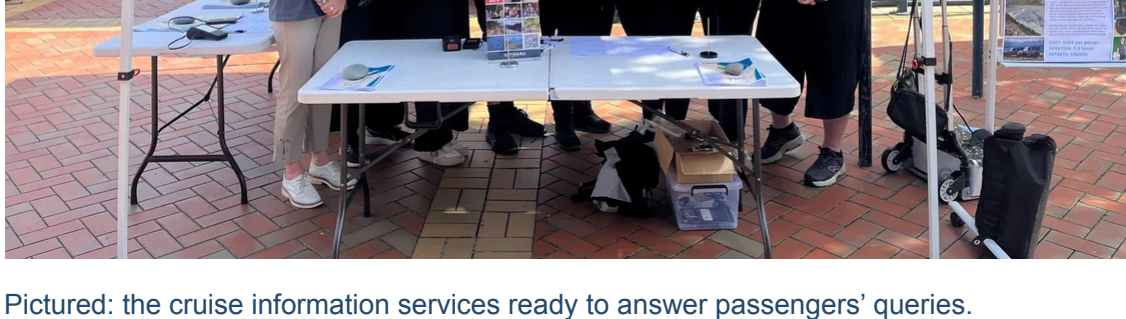

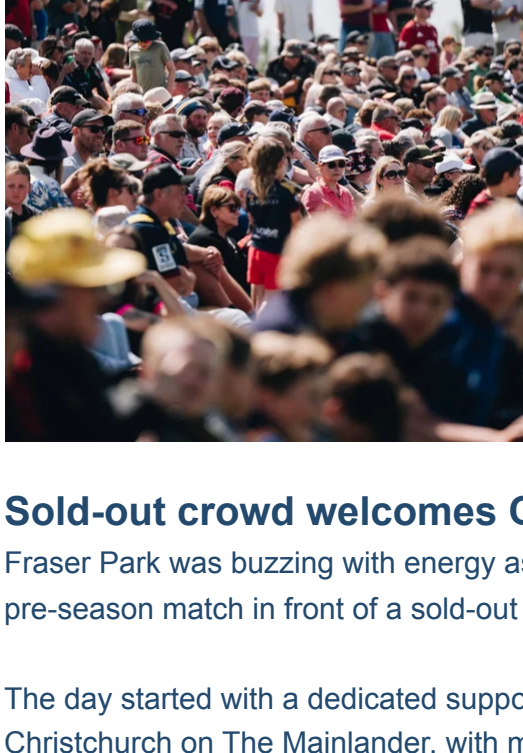
Masters Games secures Government Boost Funding

The 25th anniversary of the South Island Masters Games in Timaru this year has been announced as one of the recipients of the Government's Events Boost package.

The funding aims to help push international visitation and for the Timaru event, this will mean targeting East Coast Australia and creating a games "village" for the event.

To be eligible for the funding, the games was supported by Venture Timaru, as the Regional Tourism Organisation.

Sold-out crowd welcomes Crusaders to Timaru

Fraser Park was buzzing with energy as the Crusaders kicked off their first 2026 pre-season match in front of a sold-out crowd on 30 January.

The day started with a dedicated supporters train bringing 120 fans from Christchurch on The Mainlander, with match tickets and on-board hospitality included as part of the return journey.

The Crusaders delivered an exciting match, beating the Highlanders 33-10, the score was 28-5 at half-time.

The match marks the biggest event at Fraser Park since it was reopened in 2024 after a major upgrade of the facility.

Venture Timaru supported the event through the Major Events Support Fund, which we administer for the Timaru District Council.
